#### NGC SEA Recognition Programme 2018

At the end, a menu of chicken roulade stuffed with bell peppers and cheese, vegetable quesadillas, potato balls stuffed with olive and cheddar, devilled eggs, tossed salad with caesar's dressing, and chocolate cheesecake wontons, was presented and everyone got to indulge in the spread. Along with souvenir aprons from Fanatic, the children were also presented with Kindles by Corporate Communications Manager, Lisa Burkett and Human Resources Manager, Carol London-Sylvester.
